Introduction to reading

Scripture Reading #1: Acts 2:1-8, 11, 12

On the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place. Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting. Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them. And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other languages, as the Holy Spirit gave them this ability. At that time there were devout Jews from every nation living in Jerusalem.

When they heard the loud noise, everyone came running, and they were bewildered to hear their own languages being spoken by the believers. They were completely amazed. "How can this be?" they exclaimed. "These people are all from Galilee, and yet we hear them speaking in our own native... languages about the wonderful things God has done!" They stood there amazed and perplexed. "What can this mean?" they asked each other.

May the Spirit of God open our eyes to see, our ears to hear, and our hearts to understand.

In those days I will pour out my Spirit even on my servants—men and women alike— and they will prophesy. The sun will become dark, and the moon will turn blood red before that great and glorious day of the LORD arrives. But everyone who calls on the name of the LORD will be saved.'
